主旨：有關加拿大邊境服務署通知就原產地或出口國為我國及中國大陸之部分碳鋼螺絲螺帽扣件反傾銷案啟動價格複查事，敬請鑒察。

說明：

- 一、依據加國邊境服務署（CBSA）反傾銷暨平衡措施局貿易暨反傾銷計畫處Darryl Larson處長本（108）年4月3日致本組英文信函辦理。
- 二、前揭L處長信函要點如下：
 - (一)CBSA自本年4月3日起對旨揭我國及中國大陸進口之部分碳鋼螺絲螺帽扣件產品展開價格複查（re-investigation），以更新涉案出口廠商相關產品之正常價格及出口價格。
 - (二)上述價格複查措施係屬加國國際貿易法庭（CITT）於2015年1月5日（最早可追溯自2005年1月7日）就本案所作相關裁定之部分持續性執行事項。
 - (三)本案相關作業及時程規劃如下：
 - 1、基於執行價格複查業務需要，CBSA要求擬參與本案價

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格複查程序之相關進口商、製造商或出口商，配合填寫「Request for Information - Dumping」問卷資料。其中，進口商應於本年4月24日前回復完整資訊，出口商及政府則應於本年5月13日前回復完整資訊（相關問卷資料電子檔已先電郵寄送貴局雙邊貿易二組葉科長士嘉）。經CBSA認定未於期限內提供充分可信資料者，將以出口價格加計170%作為正常價格。

- 2、本案利害關係人登記參與價格複查程序（closing of the record for parties）截止日為本年9月30日中午（noon）；
- 3、本案利害關係人提供書面論據及答辯資料截止日分別為本年10月7日中午及15日中午。
- 4、本案預計於本年11月14日完成價格複查。CBSA完成價格複查後作成之新產品正常價格認定，將於同（14）日或調查終判認定送達出口商之日起（以日期較早者為準）生效。

(四)另CBSA為執行價格複查調查程序需要，可能需要派員赴臺拜訪我相關製造商或出口商進行查證；倘確有此需求，CBSA將事先通知我方。

三、謹查，本案係加國財政部自2005年起，就原產地或出口國為我國及中國大陸進口之部分碳鋼螺絲螺帽扣件產品課徵反傾銷稅，並於2010年及2015年均決定續課。本案遭課徵反傾銷稅產品範圍包括Wood Screws、Square and Hex Lag Screws、Sheet Metal/Tapping Screws、Thread Forming Screws、Thread Cutting Screws、Thread Rolling Screws、Self-drilling Tapping Screws、Machine Screws、Flange Screw等碳鋼螺絲螺帽扣件，相關產品稅號一般列於：7318.11.00.00、7318.12.00.00、7318.1

Dear Ms. Chi-Chuan Susan Hu:

I am writing to inform you that the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) has, on this date, initiated a re-investigation, in accordance with the *Special Import Measures Act (SIMA)*, to update the normal values and export prices respecting certain carbon steel fasteners originating in or exported from the People's Republic of China (China) and the Separate Customs Territory of Taiwan, Penghu, Kinmen and Matsu (Chinese Taipei), excluding those specifically designed for application in the automotive or aerospace industry. The re-investigation will also update the amounts of subsidy of certain carbon steel fasteners from China.

The re-investigation is part of the enforcement of the Canadian International Trade Tribunal's (CITT) order made on January 5, 2015 in Expiry Review No. RR-2014-001, continuing, with amendments, its order issued on January 6, 2010 in Expiry Review No. RR-2009-001 continuing, with amendments, its findings made on January 7, 2005 in Inquiry No. NQ-2004-005. The information collected during the course of this re-investigation will be used to determine new normal values, export prices and amounts of subsidy for future shipments in accordance with the SIMA. It is expected that the re-investigation will be concluded on November 14, 2019.

You may visit the CBSA's website to view the notice of initiation and the schedule at: www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca/sima-lmsi/ri-re/menu-eng.html. This website will also be updated when new information becomes available.

The closing of the record for parties will be at **noon** on September 30, 2019. Case arguments and reply submissions from parties shall be filed by **noon**, on October 7, 2019 and October 15, 2019, respectively. The new normal values and amounts of subsidy will become effective for subject goods released from the CBSA on or after November 14, 2019, or the date of the ruling letter to the exporter, whichever occurs first.

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
As part of the re-investigation, the CBSA is requesting information from the manufacturers/exporters of the goods in your country concerning domestic and export sales. A copy of the Request for Information – Dumping (RFI Dumping) is included in the enclosed disk for your reference.

You should also be aware that it might be necessary for officers of the CBSA to visit the manufacturers/exporters to verify information provided by them during the re-investigation. In such an eventuality, you will be notified in advance of these visits.

It should be noted that the CBSA requires a complete response from the exporters of the goods. In the event that the information provided to the CBSA by parties to the re-investigation is insufficient, the normal value and export price will be determined in such a manner as the Minister specifies.
