Precision pipe and tube steel

Exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Korea, Taiwan and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam

Investigation No. 550 into alleged dumping and subsidisation

Fourth extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 31 March 2020, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping and subsidisation of precision pipe and tube steel (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Korea, Taiwan and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam.

A full description of the goods is set out in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2020/030 (the initiation notice) available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at: www.adcommission.gov.au

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record by 20 July 2020. The SEF will set out the facts on which the Commissioner proposes to base the recommendations to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology (the Minister) in relation to this investigation.

The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister would be made in a final report, on or before, 2 September 2020.

In ADN No. 2020/078, the Commissioner extended the deadline to publish the SEF and provide the final report and make recommendations to the Minister to 30 October 2021 and 18 December 2020, respectively.

In ADN No. 2020/0127, the Commissioner extended the deadline to publish the SEF and provide the final report and recommendation to the Minister to 10 February 2021 and 1 April 2021, respectively.

Following that, ADN No. 2021/015 was published, in which the Commissioner further extended the deadline to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister to 11 May 2021 and 2 July 2021, respectively.

To allow the Commission to consider matters further, I, Justin Wickes, Acting General Manager, Investigations of the Anti-Dumping Commission, made a request to the Commissioner for an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide a final report and make recommendations to the Minister.¹

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*,² extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and to provide the final report and recommendation.

The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than **Tuesday, 1 June 2021**.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on, or before **Friday, 23 July 2021**.
