主旨：有關馬來西亞甫公告自本（113）年5月1日起將「金屬廢料進口與檢驗指南」適用範圍擴及其他23項稅號，須獲標準與工業研究院（SIRIM）准證方得進口，謹請鈞參並轉知相關公協會。

說明：

- 一、查馬來西亞投資、貿易暨工業部（Ministry of Investment, Trade and Industry, MITI；以下簡稱投貿部）前於111年1月10日頒布「金屬廢料進口與檢驗指南」（Guideline for the importation and inspection of Metal Scrap），根據該指南規定，金屬廢料稅則號列 7204（黑色金屬廢料）、7404（銅廢料）及7602（鋁廢料）等產品皆須獲馬來西亞標準與工業研究院（Standard of Industrial and Research Institute in Malaysia, SIRIM）核發之批准證書（Certificate of Approval, COA）方得進口。

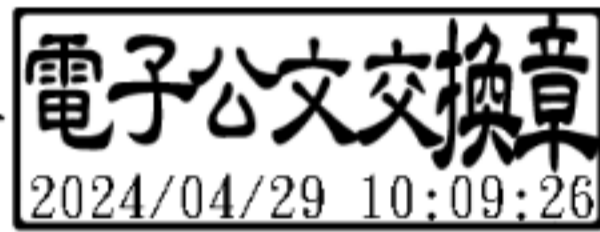

EXPANSION OF METAL SCRAP CATEGORIES THAT ARE SUBJECTED TO CERTIFICATE OF APPROVAL BY SIRIM

The Ministry of Investment, Trade and Industry in December 2021, announced the implementation of the Guideline for the Importation and Inspection of Metal Scrap that came into force since 10 January 2022. Under the existing Guidelines, the importation of metal scraps under HS code 7204 (ferrous scrap), 7404 (copper scrap) and 7602 (aluminium scrap) are subjected to the issuance of a Certificate of Approval (COA) by SIRIM.

The Government has decided to expand the category of metal scrap that are subjected to COA through the Customs Order (Import Prohibition) (Amendment) 2024 [P.U.(A) 69/2024], effective 1 May 2024. The expansion will include 23 HS Codes under the 'metal waste and scrap' category, as follows:

The Government is cognisant that the improvement to the Guideline is critical to address the severe circumvention issues involving the importation of various types of metal scrap. MITI will be engaging with the relevant stakeholders to ensure the implementation of the revised Guideline will not disrupt raw material sourcing by the manufacturers.

MITI commends the commitment by all major manufacturers and importers in complying with the Guidelines since it has been enforced in 2022. MITI calls upon the industry to continue to support the overarching objective of the Guidelines in complying with our international commitment as prescribed through the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Goal 12: Ensure Sustainable Consumption and Production Patterns as well as in upholding the Environment, Social and Governance (ESG) principles.
